2021 SCSRC Entry Level Student Scholarship Award Criteria and Guidelines

Basic Requirements: All currently enrolled Respiratory Care students in the state of South Carolina are eligible to complete application for scholarships provided by the SCSRC.

Nomination Process: Nominations can be submitted electronically or by postal mail. **Electronic nominations should be e-mailed to scholarships@scsrc.org by June 1, 2021.**

Through the assistance of the student's Program Director, the student will complete and submit the following:

This checklist of items to complete and submit the following information to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee:

1. ___ Completed scholarship application.
2. ___ Proof of current AARC membership
3. ___ Program Director verifies student active and is in good standing in a South Carolina Respiratory Care program with a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
4. ___ Program Director provides a personal letter of recommendation for the applicant.
5. ___ Student applicant writes a brief statement of his/her career goals
6. ___ Submit either an original essay or a media presentation prepared by the applicant with subject matter that demonstrates clear relevance to the practice of respiratory care or the profession.
 - Essay or media presentation may be of any healthcare topic that is currently impacting respiratory care practice or profession including but not limited to subacute and acute adult care, neonatal/pediatric care, transport, rehabilitation, home and continuing care, cardiopulmonary diagnostics, pulmonary function testing, education, research, and management.

Selection Process: The scholarship committee will review all applications and present the awards at the annual business meeting in September and published in the South Carolina Respiratory Quarterly.

Award: Up to three (3) candidates will each be awarded a monetary gift of \$400.00. Additionally, the awarded candidates will be allowed to attend the Annual Business Meeting and Student Session during the Annual SCSRC Conference in September or attend a local SCSRC sponsored conference without charge.

The deadline for application submission is June 1, 2020 **SCSRC Entry Level Student Essay Scholarship Award Guidelines**

In addition to completing and submitting the Scholarship Packet, applicant's Essay must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Conduct and submit one original copy of an essay, which demonstrates a clear point of view about a topic relevant to the current practice or profession of respiratory care, or a healthcare topic that is currently impacting respiratory care practice or the profession.
 - Subject matter may be about any aspect of respiratory care to include but may not be limited to adult sub-acute and acute care, neonatal/pediatric care, transport, rehabilitation, home and continuing care, cardiopulmonary diagnostics, pulmonary function testing, education, research or management.
2. The essay must utilize a minimum of three (3) scientific literatures/journals, citing them regularly throughout the essay to demonstrate critical thinking and establishing a clear connection of the subject matter to the respiratory care practice and profession.
3. An electronic copy of essay in Microsoft Word® must accompany the scholarship application packet.
4. The essay must contain the following elements:
 - a. Cover page with title of essay and only the last five digits of the AARC member as the only form of identification should be included for submission of essay.
 - b. Introduction, objectives, rich content and a summary must be included in essay.
 - c. Separate bibliography must be included at the end of the essay on a separate sheet of paper.
 - a. Minimum of three (3) scientific references current within 5 years.
 - b. List all references in order that they appear in essay, not in alphabetical order.
 - c. All quotes and references should be cited within body of essay per standard citation formatting choice of the applicant (APA, MLA etc.).
 - d. Essay utilizes accurate spelling, grammar, and punctuation.
 - e. Exclude any references to the applicant's college/university, employer, and clinical affiliations within the body of the essay.
 - f. Essay must be five (5) double-spaced pages containing approximately 1000 words.
 - g. Font must be 12 point, New Times Roman or Calibri.
 - h. Page margins are 1 inch on all sides.

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SCSRC Student Media Presentation Scholarship Award

In addition to completing and submitting the Scholarship Packet, applicant's Media Presentation must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Develop and submit an original media presentation created in *Microsoft PowerPoint*®2003 or higher which demonstrates a clear point of view about a topic relevant to the current practice or profession of respiratory care, or a healthcare topic that is currently affecting respiratory care practice or the profession.
2. The media presentation must utilize three (3) scientific literatures/journals, citing them regularly on the slides or expounded upon within the Notes Pages to demonstrate critical thinking and to establish a clear connection of the subject matter to the respiratory care practice and profession.
3. Subject matter may be about any aspect of respiratory care to include but may not be limited to adult sub-acute and acute care, neonatal/pediatric care, transport, rehabilitation, home and continuing care, cardiopulmonary diagnostics, pulmonary function testing, education, research, or management.
4. Attach/include a one-page summary formatting in *Microsoft Word*® detailing where and when the subject has been presented, questions received and answered, and the learning acquired because of delivering this media presentation.
5. The media presentation must contain the following elements:
 - a. Cover slide with title of essay and only the last five digits of the AARC member as the only form of identification should be included for submission of presentation.
 - b. Introduction, objectives, rich content and a summary must be included in presentation.
 - c. Separate bibliography must be included at the end of the presentation and attached in a separate document.
 - Minimum of three (3) scientific references current within 5 years.
 - List all references in order that they appear in essay, not in alphabetical order.
 - All quotes and references should be cited on slides per standard citation formatting choice of the applicant (APA, MLA etc.).
 - Citations for images or graphics that are not open source are included on slide.
 - d. Presentation utilizes accurate spelling, grammar, and punctuation.
 - e. Exclude any references to the applicant's college/university, employer, and clinical affiliations in all aspects of the media presentation.
 - f. Presentation length should be more than 20 but less than 35 slides to concisely express the objectives of the presentation.
 - g. Proper utilization of Notes Pages to provide supplemental explanations for slide content as one would offer during a "live" presentation. Or applicant could voice record their "live" presentation in lieu of utilizing Notes Pages.
 - h. Media presentation must be in *Microsoft PowerPoint*® mailed on a CD or attached if submitting via email.
